

Prevention & Control

Health Alert! Ebola which is previously known Ebola hemorrhagic fever is caused by Ebola virus that affects primates such as humans, monkeys, gorillas and chimpanzees. It is a rare but fatal disease as it affects the circulatory system leading to hemorrhage and organ failure. Average fatality according to World health Organization is 1 out of 2 infected persons.

Warning Signs and Symptoms

Initial signs and symptoms of Ebola may develop at an average of 8 to 10 days after initial exposure but may also appear within 2 to 21 days.

Initial manifestations are:

- Abrupt fever, joint pain with muscle aches, sore throat, body malaise or weakness
- As the disease progresses, an infected person will experience diarrhea, vomiting, stomach pain, hiccups, rashes and worst is internal and external bleeding (nose bleeds, unexplained bruising and pinpoint rashes). Generally humans are not infectious until they develop these symptoms

Who are at risk and how is the disease transmitted?

Recent travel to areas with endemic cases of Ebola fever increases the risk of acquiring the disease. The current outbreak of Ebola is in West Africa and spread to other countries because of infected travelers. The disease is endemic in Africa in the Republic of the Congo, Gabon, Sudan, Ivory Coast and Uganda. Health care workers who are taking care of patients with confirmed Ebola infection are also at risk of acquiring the infection.

Ebola is spread through human to human transmission via direct

Reducing the risk of transmission:

 Personal Protective Equipment such as

Gloves, Apron and Mask. These should be worn when taking care of suspected clients to block splashes or contact with infected materials.

- Hand hygiene. Wash hands with soap and water or alcohol based hand sanitizer
- Do not travel to areas with endemic cases of Ebola otherwise the traveler will be guarantined while health is monitored for 21 days after return.
- Patients with possible infection are isolated
- Avoid direct contact with infected patients without PPE
- Notify health officials if you have been exposed to infection, has presenting signs and symptoms consistent with Ebola disease or knew someone who might be infected. You can contact Public Health Canada at 1-866-225-0709.
