
# Mosaic's Your Opinion Matters Survey - Program Survey Data

Over the spring and summer of 2019 we had over **600 individuals** attend programs at Mosaic! These programs include both one-off events like our Senior's Appreciation Day Event and ongoing programs like our weekly and monthly pole walking and knitting groups. Mosaic is a huge advocate of socialization and relationship building, which is why we offer a selection of programs throughout the year. In this newsletter we wanted to illustrate how our programs have positively impacted the communities that we serve. We are thankful to all members that continue to show their support and interest in Mosaic programs. We hope that the data illustrated here will serve as a testimony that social programs are more than just important, but that they are necessary in creating meaningful connections to lead healthy, happy lives. Just look for yourself!

Data illustrated was gathered between April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019 - August 30<sup>th</sup>, 2019 using **Mosaic's Your Opinion Matters Survey.** There were 40 completed surveys by community members who attended our one-off programs like Mosaic's Senior's Appreciation Day Event and Mindfulness Workshop.

### **Your Opinion Matters Survey** (Question #1)

71% of Attendees have rated Mosaic programs as "Excellent" while 29% have rated programs as "Very Good".



### **Your Opinion Matters Survey** (Question #3)

44.74% of Attendees found that the programs during this time were "Extremely Beneficial" while 42.11% found programs "Very Beneficial"

Hospice Services supports Clients at the end stages of life and their Caregivers. Our team provides practical, physical and emotional support to maintain comfort and quality of life for the Client as a complement to professional medical care. Our services also provide essential support and respite to a Caregiver supporting a loved one at home. We are sensitive to personal, cultural and religious beliefs and practices and work in collaboration with our Clients to coordinate and deliver individualized care.

Through Hospice Services and with the support of a member of our team, Clients can access: Hospice Case Management services, Complementary Therapy, and Visiting Volunteer support. All FREE of charge. Individuals seeking the services of our hospice program are assigned a Case Manager. The Case Manager provides information and education, works with the Client and Caregiver to identify any additional support needs, works with other organizations to obtain services, coordinates care, and works with the Visiting Volunteer to provide support in the home.

We have a team of volunteers who have received intensive training in the delivery of support services to Clients at the end of life. Our volunteers are caring and compassionate, providing companionship, practical and physical assistance, as well as emotional and spiritual care to the Clients they support. Visiting Volunteers also play an important role in providing respite for family and Caregivers.

Hospice Services are enhanced by our team of registered Complementary Therapists who volunteer their services to both Hospice Clients and their Caregivers to enhance quality of life and assist with the physical and emotional challenges faced at end of life. Complementary Therapy Services include:

- Registered Massage Therapy
- Expressive Arts
- Therapeutic Touch
- Reiki

We support Clients and Caregivers on their journey through grief in collaboration with our Caregiver Support program. Staff and volunteers provide support to individuals who have a terminal illness, are experiencing anticipatory grief, have experienced a loss, or who would like to remember a loved one who has passed.



# A wider perspective on Person Centered Care

Person centered care recognises that a "patient" is first and foremost a person. While illness or injury may affect us, they do not and should not define us.

Without understanding the wider person we cannot address a person's needs and preferences. Person centeredness extends beyond the health care setting to a person's home and community. This is being increasingly recognised through social prescribing and asset-based community development

which views people as assets rather than problems.

Viewing persons from the perspective of what they can do as opposed to what they cannot is also part of the person centered spectrum. As human beings our need for personal growth and social and emotional meaning continues irrespective of physical limitations.

Person centered recognises humans as a social species. It recognises our identities as persons and members of groups, the importance of social interaction, culture, spirituality, meaning-making and personal growth. It also addresses social issues of inclusiveness, empathy and education.

People with visible and invisible "disabilities" are exposed to greater risk of social exclusion and negative assessment of personal worth and meaning.

Our social and emotional needs have profound impact on our being. Research into loneliness reveals that it is an evolved evolutionary trait designed to push ourselves back into social contact. Stigma likewise has developed over time to help humans detect threats to social groups. To overcome stigma we depend on meaningful interaction.

At the heart of person centered interaction lies empathy. Empathy is our ability to understand another person's position and perspective from our own experiences, neurological processes and the information we are able to gain from communicating with that other person. Research shows that empathy is important in developing cooperation and trust as well as acceptance and understanding of identity.

The ability to be empathic and to overcome stigma requires that we as a society are better educated about the importance of social interaction and of human rights. This need for greater empathy requires greater focus on effective listening and communicating with others.

Failure to address social and emotional health and well-being within health care is noted in the academic literature, especially with respect to dementia, Parkinson's, end of life and home and institutional care in general.

But person centered care and person centeredness does

not stop at the person with the illness or injury. It includes the very important care partners or family caregivers. Their own health and social and emotional needs are related and impacted, and therefore have relevance and importance. Likewise, health care providers are also "persons" and attention

to their personhood impacts their ability to provide the same. As a provider of home care in the community we have our own model of person centered care focused on the social and emotional needs of the person. At its core we have a meaningful conversation framework that helps provide a non-clinical lens of engagement.

Beyond the conversation we have a framework supporting development of engagement in interests and activities that have meaning to the person. Within this process we look especially for opportunities for community interaction and connection. Family and friends and social networks are also encouraged to learn about meaningful communication, engaging in community and with the "person".

We believe that the complete model of person centered care requires an emergent wider supporting community architecture and higher levels of cooperation between community organisations, individuals, for profit and public health.

Person centered care can mean many things to many people. We feel that at its core lies the person and, behind the person, the reality that we have evolved as a social species with highly important social, emotional and spiritual needs.
